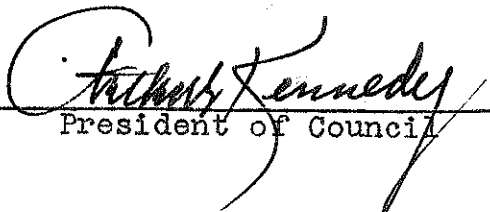

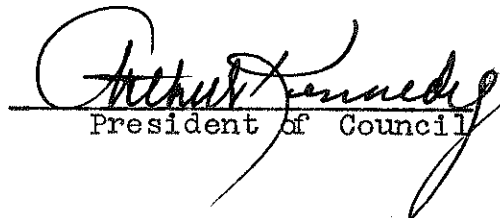

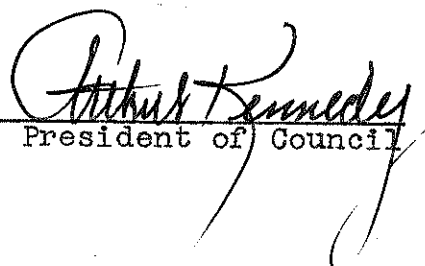

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AND ADOPTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE NELSONVILLE CITY RECREATION COMMISSION MADE WITH REGARD TO THE OPERATION OF THE SWIMMING POOL

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Whereas the members of the Recreation Commission of the City of Nelsonville heretofore appointed have recommended:

1. That an overall manager of recreational activities be appointed and that he receive a salary in the amount of One Hundred Seventy-Five Dollars (\$175.00) per month for the months of June, July and August for the year 1953 and that Clarence Tyo be employed as such overall manager.
2. That three pool attendants be appointed at a salary of Sixty Dollars (\$60.00) per month each for the months of June, July and August for the year 1953 and that Nancy Jane Smith, Mary Beth Goss and Phyllis Ann Hall be employed as such pool attendants.
3. That a life guard be employed at a salary of \$145.00 per month for the months of June, July and August of the year 1953 and that Bob Wolfe be employed as such life guard.
4. That the Recreation Commission be empowered to employ an extra life guard at such times as it appears such extra life guard be necessary and that he be reimbursed for such services at a stipend of not to exceed One Dollar (\$1.00) per hour.

Therefore be it resolved by the Council of the City of Nelsonville,

Section 1. That the recommendations hereinbefore set forth be, and the same hereby are approved, adopted, and made effective as though fully repeated and set forth in this Resolution.

Section 2. That the Auditor be, and he hereby is, aughorized to issue warrants against the Recreation Fund for the payment of such services as are indicated and to the persons performing such services as hereinbefore set forth, upon approval of the President of the Recreation Commission.

A RESOLUTION TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR STREET REPAIR PROJECTS
AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas the sum of Ninety-Five Hundred Dollars (\$9500.00) has heretofore been appropriated to the purpose of the paving project of East Franklin Street and Fort Street, and,

Whereas the aforesaid sum is insufficient to cover the lowest and best bid submitted on said project and it is desired to accomplish said project, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF Ohio:

Section I. That the additional sum of \$500.00 be, and the same hereby is appropriated from the Auto and Gas Fund and transferred to the Special Street Repair Fund, and the Auditor be, and he hereby is, authorized to expend said funds for the purpose of the aforesaid paving project.

Section II. That the sum of \$5,000.00 be and the same hereby is transferred and appropriated from the Auto and Gas Fund to the Special Street Repair Fund for the purpose of defraying the cost of improving by semi-hard topping certain streets in the City of Nelsonville, which work has heretofore been authorized and directed by the Council of the City of Nelsonville,

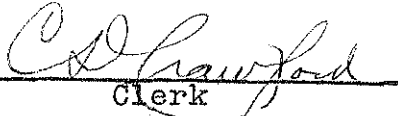

Section 5. That this Resolution be declared to be an emergency Resolution necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

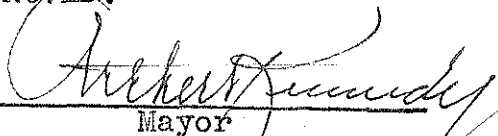

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITAL PROPOSED LOCATION AND OFFERING SITES OF GROUND THEREFOR

Whereas, the General Assembly of the State of Ohio has appropriated funds for construction of a Tuberculosis Hospital in Southeastern Ohio, and

Whereas, it has been informally proposed from time to time that the City of Nelsonville, Athens County, Ohio, be considered for the location of said hospital, and

Whereas, it is the desire of the Mayor and Council of the City of Nelsonville to concur in this proposal, and to extend an official invitation to encourage the development thereof, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, duly assembled in regular monthly session Monday, October 12, 1953, that an official communication be, and the same hereby is, directed to the State Department of Health and its Director, Dr. John D. Porterfield, respectfully petitioning that Nelsonville be considered and accepted as the site of the proposed state TB hospital.

Council emphasizes that two excellent sites are here available, briefly described, with other pertinent details, as follows:

1. Former Camp Nelson (CCC Camp), one mile north of Nelsonville Public Square, on improved street. A large acreage is here available, the same being owned by Wayne National Forest. Title to the necessary acreage may be secured from the United States Government, Department of the Interior, on an exchange basis by transfer of equal acreage. A private landholder will make this exchange without costs to the State.

2. Ten acres of high level ground, very desirable, the same being within 1000 feet of the new and modern Mount St. Mary Hospital, and being readily accessible by improved streets. The present owner will donate this site for the project.

3. The City of Nelsonville, by its Council and Mayor, hereby guarantees to make available to either of the above named sites, in the event either should be selected for the site of the hospital, all necessary utility services, including water and sewer mains.

4. The Mayor and Council together with the other officials, of the City of Nelsonville hereby go on record as being 100 per cent in favor of this project, believing that such TB hospital is greatly needed in Southeastern Ohio, and also that the Nelsonville location is the most central and convenient to the entire district said hospital is desired to serve.

5. Full co-operation of the City and its officials with the State Department of Health and its Director, in advancing this project, is hereby pledged.

The Clerk of the Council of the City of Nelsonville is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the State Department of Health and its Director, Dr. John D. Porterfield.

A RESOLUTION TRANSFERRING FUNDS, APPROPRIATING MONEY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1: The the sums of money hereinafter indicated in the several sections of this Resolution be, and the same hereby are, transferred from the indicated funds to the indicated funds and appropriated to the indicated purposes:

A. The Sun of Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) transferred from the General Contingency Fund to the General Safety Fund for the purpose of meeting current operating expenses.

B. The sum of Eight Hundred Dollars (\$800.00) from the General Contingency Fund to the General Safety Fund, Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) of which shall be used for incidental expenses of the Fire Department, Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) appropriated to the Fire Hydrant Fund.

E. The sum of One Hundred-Twenty Five Dollars (\$125.00) from the Permanant Improvement Fund to the Gas Fund to reimburse said fund for labor and material cost incurred in constructing the floor of the Light Plant Building.

F. The sum of Fifty-Three Dollars (\$53.00) from the Building Maintenance and Replacement Fund to the Gas Fund to be used in defraying expenses hereinbefore incurred by use of the truck in hauling gravel and cement block for filler for said Light Plant Building.

G. The sum of Sixty-Four Dollars and Thirty Cents (\$64.30) from the Special Sewer Fund, the sum of Four Hundred Seventy-Six Dollars and Sixty-Nine Cents (\$476.69) from the Park Fund and the Sum of Two Hundred and Four Dollars and Thirty Five Cents (\$204.35) from the Light Deposit Fund transferred to the General Fund for the purpose of closing out the inactive accounts under said special sewer fund, park fund and light deposit fund.

Section 2.

That the Auditor be and he hereby is authorized to make said transfers and draw said necessary warrents against said funds as hereinabove set forth.
