Whereas, there has been organized a volunteer fire department for the City of Nelsonville whose members meet once each month, and,

Whereas, in occasion of need by the Fire Department said Fire Department calls upon said volunteer firemen to render aid and assistance to the regularly constituted Fire Department, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO

Section 1. That said members of the volunteer fire department be paid the sum of One Dollar per month for attendance at the regular monthly meeting, provided, however, that in order to be so paid such volunteer member must have been present at the regular monthly meeting.

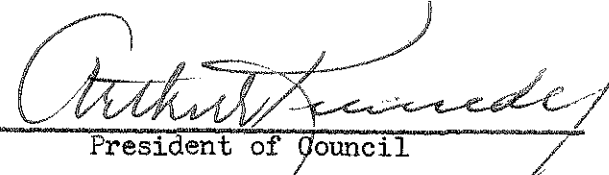
Section 2. That the volunteer firemen be paid the sum of Five Dollars for each fire at which they are called upon to render assistance to the regular Fire Department provided, however, that such aid and assistance shall be paid for only if requested by the member of the regular Fire Department in charge at said fire.

Section 3. That the Chief of the Fire Department shall, each month, file with the Auditor of the City of Nelsonville a statement, verified by him indicating the number of meetings attended and fires engaged in by the volunteer fire department, together with an itemization of the members of the volunteer department who were present therat and the amount owed to them by the City.


Section 4. That upon receiving said verified statement, the Auditor shall issue warrants of the City of Nelsonville against the fire department account for the payment thereof.

Section 5. That this Resolution be declared to be an emergency resolution necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

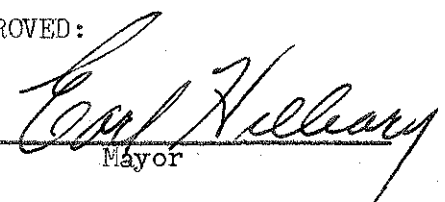

Section 3. That the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is authorized to include in said specification for said blacktopping that the intersections in the distances be blacktopped.

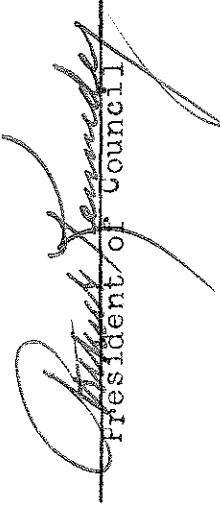

Whereas, it is desired by this Council that a minimum of expense to determine whether or not such work can in fact be more economically achieved, now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the furnishing to the City of Nelsonville of suitable mechanical street sweeping devices, which bids shall entertain bids to the City for the furnishing of said equipment on a lease arrangement, which lease-rental arrangement shall provide in part that in the event said mechanical device does, after a proper interval, achieve the desired results, the City may proceed to purchase said equipment at a specified sum.

Section 2. The equipment proposed to be furnished and advertised for shall contain, as a minimum, the following specifications:

The motor pick-up street sweeper furnished shall be self-propelled, gasoline engine driven, three-wheel type, with steering on a single rear wheel, capable of sweeping a minimum of seven foot swath, having a turning radius of approximately 14 feet.

Engine, transmissions and differentials shall be of approved types, with positive two wheel drive, engine, transmission and differential replacement parts shall be available from local sources.

Gutter broom shall be right hand mounted of the vertical digger type, adjustable in the field for pressure, wear, and gutter angle, with free floating suspension. Gutter broom shall be mounted ahead of the front wheels. Pick-up broom shall be 36" in diameter, adjustable for pressure and wear. Both brooms shall have at least two speeds forward, and shall be reversible in direction of rotation, and shall operate independently of the forward motion of the machine.

Of approved design shall be provided to carry sweepings from the pickup broom to the dirt hopper. Design must provide for loading of hopper to 100% of rated capacity. Elevator shall have two operating speeds, shall be reversible in direction and shall operate independently of the motion of the sweeper.

Shall have fillable capacity of not less than three cubic yards.

Shall consist of a water tank of capacity not less than 170 gallons with water under pressure to spray nozzles in the front of the sweeper along the entire swath.

Sweeper must have three sweeping speeds and reverse to meet all conditions. A fourth or traveling speed must be provided to insure a speed minimum of 18 m.p.h. with full load.

Shall be provided to raise and lower brooms and to open and close hopper for discharging.

Section 3. That in the event suitable bids are received, the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder, reserving, however, to himself, the right to reject any and all bids.
