AN ORDINANCE ENACTING ADMINISTRATIVE CODE SECTIONS TO _____ OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That sections _____ to _____ of the Codified Ordinances are hereby enacted to read as follows:

Section _____: The City of Nelsonville shall furnish to each regularly employed full time police office the following items of dress:

- One Wool Blouse
- Three Wool Winter Shirts
- Two Wool Winter Trousers
- Three Summer Shirts
- Two Summer Trousers
- One Wool Top Coat
- One Rain Coat
- One Belt and Holster

Section _____: That the City of Nelsonville shall furnish to each regularly employed firemen

- Two Wool Winter Trousers
- Two Summer Trousers
- Three Wool Winter Shirts
- Three Summer Shirts
- One Wool Dress Coat

Section _____: That the Auditor of the City of Nelsonville shall establish the uniform fund, as a part of the General Safety Fund, against which requisitions for the items hereinabove set forth shall be drawn, and upon approval of the Chief of Police and Chief of the Fire Department, vouchers issued and the items of equipment purchased.

Section _____: That each man qualified as a police officer or fire officer of the City of Nelsonville shall be entitled to draw against said equipment to the extent of the sum of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) per year for uniform equipment.

Section _____: That in the event a patrolman, police officer, fireman or fire officer shall not remain in the employ of the City of Nelsonville for more than one year, said officer shall purchase his own uniform and shall not, in any fashipn, be reimbursed by the City of Nelsonville therefore.

Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for the public peace health and safety for the reason that it is necessary to properly uniform our police and fire officers for the maintenance of the dignity, peace and safety of the City of Nelsonville, and shall take effect on the 1st day of March, 1956.

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING TRAFFIC CODE SECTION _____
OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE,
STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Section _____ of the Traffic Code
Ordinances are hereby enacted to read as follows:

I - The parking of motor vehicles on West Washington Street immediately in front of the United State Post Office Building except as hereinafter provided, is hereby prohibited.

II - The Safety and Service Director may, at his discretion, erect parking meters providing for the parking of motor vehicles in front of said Post Office Building for periods not to exceed five minutes in duration, and motor vehicles shall not be parked for such longer time, the purpose thereof being to enable citizens to enter and leave the Post Office and transact their business.

III - Parking of motor vehicles and leaving the same unattended in front of the United States Mail Depository erected for the purpose of receiving mail from motor vehicles is prohibited. Motor vehicles may, however, stop and the occupants thereof place mail in said mail box without penalty.

IV - Violation of any of the foregoing sections of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not to exceed the sum of Fifty Dollars.

Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING ADMINISTRATIVE CODE SECTION OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Sections to of the Codified Ordinances are hereby enacted to read as follow:

I Sick Leave: Each full time employee, whose salary or wage is paid in full or in part by the City of Nelsonville, shall be entitled for each completed month of service to sick leave of one and one-fourth work days with pay. Employees may use sick leave, upon approval of the responsible administrative officer of the employing unit, for absence due to illness, injury, exposure to contagious disease which could be communicated to other employees, and to illness or death in the employee's immediate family. Unused sick leave shall be cumulative up to ninety work days, unless more than ninety days are approved by the responsible administrative officer of the employing unit. Provisional appointees or those who render part time, seasonal, intermittent, per diem or hourly service shall be entitled to sick leave for the time actually worked at the same rate as that granted full time employees. The responsible administrative officer of the employing unit may require the employee to furnish a satisfactory affidavit that his absence was furnished by illness due to any of the causes mentioned in this section.

II Vacation Leave: Each regular full time employee in the several offices and departments of the City service, after service of one year, shall be entitled during the year thereafter, to one calendar week, excluding legal holidays, vacation leave with full pay. Employees having two or more years of service are entitled to two calendar weeks of such leave.

Section II - That this Ordinance be declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE,

Section 1. That Section _____ of the codified
ordinances is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"Commercial vehicles while loading and/or unloading
shall be permitted to park for a period of ten
minutes in the closest available parking space to
the business from which they are receiving, or to
which they are discharging, their loads."

Section 2. For the reason that the parking problem in the
City of Nelsonville has created many traffic hazards, this
ordinance is declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for
public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately
upon its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING TRAFFIC CODE SECTION _____
AND _____ OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE,
STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Section _____ of the Codified
Ordinances is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"parking of motor vehicles is hereby prohibited on
that part of Watkins Street lying South of Canal
Street on the East side of Watkins Street."

Section 2. Section _____ of the Codified
Ordinances is hereby enacted to read as follows:

"speed limit for vehicular traffic on Watkins Street
south of Canal Street shall be twenty five miles
per hour."

Section 3. For the reason that the municipal park lies at
the south end of Watkins Street and children are frequently travel-
ing upon Watkins Street, the foregoing sections of the Codified
Ordinances are declared to be emergency measures for the
preservation of the public safety and shall take effect immediately
upon their adoption.

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING CODE SECTION TO OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Sections to of the Codified Ordinances are hereby enacted to read as follows:

"1. The cost of the initial license for any cab company establishing a cab business within the City of Nelsonville shall be the sum of One Thousand Dollars. Each subsequent license shall be charged for at the same rate as set forth in the former regulations."

"2. Each cab company operating cabs upon the streets of the City of Nelsonville and having its principal office and place of business in the City of Nelsonville shall operate and maintain a garage for the maintenance of motor vehicles or have a bona fide contract with a garage properly equipped to service and maintain such motor vehicles, a copy of which contract shall be on file with the other papers incidental to the owning and operating under a city franchise of cabs in the City of Nelsonville."

Section 2. For the reason that the maintenance of proper cab equipment is vital to the best interests of the City of Nelsonville and necessary to the protection of the public peace, health and safety, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH THE GRADE OF THE CENTER LINE OF AN EXTENSION OF SCOTT STREET AND PART OF PLEASANTVIEW AVENUE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That whereas extensive repairs are being made to Pleasantview Avenue and the Scott Street Extension and it is necessary to establish the grade thereof THE following grade be, and the same hereby is established as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of Scott Street and Verity Street at United States Geodetic Survey Datum elevation 727.92 said point being at Station 6 + 16.72 of the centerline of survey; thence easterly along the centerline of the proposed extension of Scott Street on a plus 6.76% grade 133.28 feet to USG elevation 736.93; thence on the same course 25.0 feet to elevation 738.49 feet, 25.0 feet to elevation 739.77 feet, 25.0 feet to elevation 740.88 feet, 25.0 feet to elevation 741.66 feet, 25.0 feet to elevation 742.17 feet and 25.0 feet to elevation 742.40 feet, said last point being at Station 9 + 00 of the centerline of survey and being at the intersection of the Scott Street extension and Pleasantview Avenue; thence along said centerline of survey and Pleasantview Avenue on a plus 0.4% grade 250 feet to elevation 743.40 feet; thence on the same course 50 feet to elevation 744.11 feet, 50 feet to elevation 745.82 feet, 50 feet to elevation 749.56 feet, and 50 feet to elevation 754.30 feet; said last point at Station 13+50 of said centerline of survey; thence along said centerline and Pleasantview Avenue on a plus 10.5% grade 400.0 feet to elevation 796.30 feet at Station 17+50; thence on the same course 50 feet to elevation 800.89 feet; thence on the same course 50 feet to elevation 804.35 feet, said last point being at Station 18+50; thence along said centerline and Pleasantview Avenue on a plus 5.6% grade 200.0 feet to elevation 815.55 feet at Station 20+50; thence on the same course 50.0 feet to elevation 818.60 feet, 50.0 feet to elevation 822.15 feet, 50.0 feet to elevation 826.34 and 50 feet to elevation 828.20 feet at Station 22+50; thence along said centerline and Pleasantview Avenue on a plus 4.5% grade 150.0 feet to elevation 834.95 feet at Station 24+00; thence along the same course 50.0 feet to elevation 837.64 feet; 50.0 feet to elevation 841.20 feet and 50.0 feet to elevation 845.20 feet at Station 25+50, said point being in the Corporation line of the City of Nelsonville and in the Athens County-Hocking County line.

Section 2. For the reason that the work is about to progress and it is necessary to get said street in passage condition the foregoing is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING TRAFFIC CODE SECTIONS AND OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Sections and of the codified ordinances are hereby enacted to read as follows:

No person shall operate a motor vehicle, tractless trolley, or streetcar in and upon the streets and highways in the City of Nelsonville at a speed greater or less than is reasonable or proper, having due regard for the traffic, surface and width of the street or highway and any other conditions, and no person shall drive any motor vehicle, tractless trolley, or streetcar in and upon any street or highway at a greater speed than will permit him to bring it to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead.

It shall be prima facie lawful for the operator of a motor vehicle, tractless trolley or street car to operate the same at a speed not exceeding the following: (a.) twenty miles per hour when passing a school building or the grounds thereof during school recess and which children are going to or leaving school during the opening or closing hours, and when appropriate signs giving notice of the existence of the school are erected;

(b) Thirty-five miles per hour in all other portions of the Municipal Corporation.

Section 2. Whoever violates Section of the Traffic Code shall, for a first offense, be fined not more than Fifty Dollars; for a second offense within one year after the first offense, such person shall be fined not less than Ten nor more than one hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than ten days, /or both, for each subsequent offense within one year after the first offense, such person shall be fined not less than twenty-five nor more than two hundred dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty days, or both; provided that when any person is found guilty of a first offense for driving faster than thirty-five miles an hour while passing through a school zone during recess or while children are going to or leaving school during the opening or closing hours, such person may, in addition to the penalty hereinabove provided, be imprisoned for not more than five days.

Section 3. For the reason that it is necessary in order to preserve life and property in the Municipal Corporation of Nelsonville, this Section is declared to be an emergency Section necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
