A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE YORK TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES TO PROVIDE MUTUAL FIRE PROTECTION, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas the York Township Trustees have adopted a Resolution providing for the purchase of certain fire fighting equipment; and

Whereas said Resolution provides that such equipment shall be housed, operated, and partially maintained by the Nelsonville City Fire Department for the mutual use and protection of the City of Nelsonville and York Township; and

Whereas the City of Nelsonville is desirous of entering into an agreement with York Township for mutual fire protection; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to enter into a three year contract with the York Township Trustees to embody the terms of the Resolution submitted by said Trustees providing for mutual fire protection; and to work out such details as may be necessary and desirable to implement said agreement.

Section 2. For the reason that such an agreement will augment the fire protection for the City of Nelsonville, this Resolution is declared to be an emergency resolution necessary for the public peace, health and safety, and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ENTER INTO A LEASE AGREEMENT WITH THE F. AND B. MANUFACTURING COMPANY: FIXING THE TERMS THEREOF; AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas the F. & B. Manufacturing Company is a successor to the Sharp Manufacturing Company, and

Whereas the F. & B. Manufacturing Company wants to rent the Municipal building of the City of Nelsonville on Factory Road, and will assume the back rent owed by said Sharp Manufacturing Company; and

Whereas the City of Nelsonville is agreeable to renting said premises to said Company; now therefore:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is, authorized to enter into a lease agreement with the F. & B. Manufacturing Company for the rental of the front portion of the municipal building of the City of Nelsonville on Factory Road at a monthly rental of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) payable quarterly; and an additional quarterly payment of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to be applied to the back rent owed by the Sharp Manufacturing Company, said quarterly payment to continue until all said back rent is paid.

Section 2. That all other terms, provisions, conditions and stipulations shall be the same as in the lease negotiated with the Sharp Manufacturing Company for the year 1958-1959.

Section 3. For the reason that the expense of the building is a continuing matter and is presently going on, this Resolution is declared to be an emergency Resolution necessary for the peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS, TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT TO PURCHASE A 1959 MODEL FOUR DOOR SEDAN CAR AND TO DISPOSE OF THE PRESENT POLICE CAR, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the furnishing to the City of Nelsonville one 1959 model four door sedan vehicle, which said vehicle shall be black in color, possessed of an eight (8) cylinder engine of not less than 300 H.P., 60 ampere generator, 70 ampere heavy duty battery, heavy duty clutch, two (2) spot lights, heater and defroster, two (2) outside mirrors, arm rests, two (2) sun visors, electric windshield wipers, windshield washers, undercoat, standard transmission, 15 inch wheels and 7:10 tires with tubes, and of such other mechanical qualifications as the Safety and Service Director in his discretion may deem necessary.

Section 2. That the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to dispose of the 1957 Ford four door sedan presently in use as a City Police Cruiser for the best price obtainable, and, at his discretion, to use said 1957 Ford as a trade in vehicle for the acquisition of the vehicle mentioned in section one hereof.

Section 3. That the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to enter into a contract pursuant to his receipt of the lowest and best bid for the furnishing of said vehicle, in accordance with the statutes in such case made and provided.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN MILL LIMITATION

Whereas, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said City of Nelsonville, Athens County, Ohio; therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO two thirds of all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy an additional one mill tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of the City of Nelsonville for the purpose of meeting current operating expenses of the City of Nelsonville at a rate not exceeding one mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to ten cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation for five years, and be it further

RESOLVED, that said levy be placed upon the tax lists of the current tax year in compliance with the provisions of Section 5705.34 Revised Code if fifty-five percent or more of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Council of the City of Nelsonville be and he is hereby directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections, Athens County, Ohio, not later than 4:00 P.M. of the 90th day before the day of the general election, and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law.

Whereas, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said City of Nelsonville, Athens County, Ohio; therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO, two thirds of all members elected thereto concurring, that it is necessary to levy an additional one-half mill tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of the City of Nelsonville for the purpose of providing and maintaining recreational facilities for the citizens of said City of Nelsonville at a rate not exceeding one-half mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to five cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation for two years and, be it further

RESOLVED, that said levy be placed upon the tax lists of the current tax year in compliance with the provisions of Section 5705.34 Revised Code if fifty-five percent or more of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk of this Council of the City of Nelsonville be and he is hereby directed to certify a copy of the Resolution to the Board of Elections, Athens County, Ohio, not later than 4:00 P.M. of the 90th day before the day of the general election, and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law.

A RESOLUTION MAKING THE SEWAGE DISPOSAL PLANT FACILITIES AVAILABLE TO SEPTIC TANK CLEANERS, ESTABLISHING A SERVICE CHARGE, PROVIDING FOR SUPERVISION, SETTING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Sewage Disposal Plant facilities be, and the same hereby are, made available to Septic Tank Cleaners under the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. That the service charge for such facilities be three dollars (\$3.00) per tank load payable in advance to the Water Office and evidenced by a ticket showing payment.

Section 3. That the dumping of each tank load be made under the supervision of a Sewage Disposal Plant employee at a manhole designated by such employee.

Section 4. Whoever violates Section 2 or Section 3 of this Resolution shall be fined not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

Section 5. For the reason that lack of adequate disposal facilities for Septic Tank Cleaners is a menace to health, this Resolution is declared to be an emergency Resolution necessary to the public peace, health and safety, and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

That the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) be, and the same hereby is authorized transferred from the Street Department Contingencies Account to the following accounts of the Street Department in the respective amounts, and said respective sums are hereby further appropriated for use in the payment of obligations of said Department:
