A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE AMOUNT OF TAXES THAT MAY BE RAISED BY LEVY AT THE MAXIMUM RATE AUTHORIZED BY LAW WITHOUT A VOTE OF THE ELECTORS TO BE INSUFFICIENT AND DECLARING THE NECESSARY OF A LEVY IN EXCESS OF SUCH RATE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, TWO-THIRDS OF ALL THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING:

Section 1. That the amount of taxes that may be raised by the levy of taxes at the maximum rate authorized by R.C. 5705.02 on the taxable property in the City of Nelsonville will be insufficient to provide adequate amount for the necessary requirements of said City and that it is necessary for the purpose of providing additional funds for recreational purposes that taxes be levied on the taxable property in said City for the period of five years, at a rate in excess of such maximum rate authorized by said R.C. Section 5705.02.

Section 2. That it is necessary to levy taxes for five years at the rate for each year of five-tenth mills on each dollar of the tax valuation of the taxable property within the City, one-tenth mill being additional, the four-tenth mill being an existing levy, in excess of the rate authorized by said R.C. Section 5705.02.

Section 3. That the Clerk be, and she is hereby, directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Elections of Athens County, Ohio, in order that said Board of Elections may make the necessary arrangements for the submission of such question to the electors of said City, as provided by law.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS FOR BULK CHEMICAL TANKS AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, it has been determined that a substantial savings can be effected by modifying the method of introduction of chemicals into the City water system by the use of bulk tanks and further to more closely regulate the introduction of said chemicals and dispense with unnecessary labor in said process;

Whereas, it is necessary and desirable for the public health and safety to more closely regulate, if possible, the potability of the water furnished the citizens of this Community; and

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE:

Section 1. That the Safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids looking to the furnishing and installation of chemical storage tanks which will control the introduction of lime and soda ash into the city water supply and to make the necessary arrangements for the acquisition and installation of the same.

Section 2. For the reason set forth above in the preamble hereto and for the additional reason that it is desirable to effectuate said improvement at the earliest time permitted by law, this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency Resolution necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

Whereas said City is in grave need of such equipment and cannot afford to acquire the same, now, therefore;

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE VILLAGE OF MURRAY CITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF MUTUAL FIRE PROTECTION AGREEMENT AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas the City of Nelsonville, Athens County, Ohio, has heretofore negotiated with the Mayor and Council of the Village of Murray City, Ohio, looking to the mutual fire protection for property in both political sub-divisions and have reached a mutually satisfactory agreement;

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE:

Section 1. That the Safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to enter into a contract with the Mayor and Clerk of the Village of Murray City, Ohio, providing in essence for mutual fire protection and under and by terms of this agreement the Village of Murray City shall pay to the City of Nelsonville the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300) a year, said agreement to be retroactive to the 1st day of January 1966.

Section 2. And also pursuant to said agreement, upon delivery of the ladder truck to the Fire Department of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, the City of Nelsonville agrees to lease to Murray City the 1939 Chevrolet Fire Truck for the sum of One Dollar per year, the Village of Murray City to maintain said truck, the Fire Chief of Nelsonville to inspect said leased vehicle at least once each year.

Section 3. Whereas it is mutually desirable that the fire protection agreements between these two political sub-divisions be in full force, this Resolution is declared to be an emergency Resolution necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

1. Expansion of water treatment facilities to increase the capacity for current and future needs and to provide facilities to treat either ground water (wells) or river water; and c. Develop a second well to insure both adequate quality and adequate quantity of water at all times.
2. That Earl Hilleary, Mayor, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the Economic Development Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce, may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized to be filed.
3. That this resolution is declared to be an emergency measure. The reason for the emergency lies in the fact that the services authorized are needed to provide essential water services and therefore immediately necessary to the preservation of the health, safety and welfare of this community.

WHEREAS, the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, by Resolution No. 944, dated March 1, 1965, designated William M. Hoffman as representative of the City of Nelsonville for the purpose of obtaining an interest-free Federal advance, and

WHEREAS, William H. Hoffman's term of office was completed on December 31, 1965 and

WHEREAS, by said Resolution No. 944 dated March 1, 1965, authorization was provided for funds, in addition to the advance, as may be required to defray the cost of plan preparation, and

WHEREAS, by letter dated May 2, 1966, the Consulting Engineers of the City of Nelsonville stated that the cost of the project revised to meet current needs was estimated at \$397,000:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, as follows:

SECTION 1: That Earl Hilleary, Mayor, be and he is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the applicant for the purpose of furnishing to the United States such information, data and documents pertaining to the application for an advance as may be required and otherwise to act as the authorized representative of the applicant in connection with this application.

SECTION 2: That the additional cost of engineering services (\$8600.00) due to the increased scope of the project, if not sooner available, will be paid by the City of Nelsonville when construction is financed.

SECTION 3: That the proposed method of financing the City of Nelsonville's share of the cost of construction is by means of general obligation bonds, subject to approval by the voters.

SECTION 4: That this Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure. The reason for the emergency lies in the fact that the services authorized are needed to provide essential water services and therefore immediately necessary to the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of this community.
