AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS FOR A POLICE VEHICLE, TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR ACQUISITION OF THE SAME, TO APPROPRIATE MONEY AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, it has been determined that a new police vehicle is necessary and desirable to adequately provide for the needs of the police department of the City of Nelsonville

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE:

SECTION; That the Safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for bids looking to the acquisition of an adequate vehicle for police duties, and upon receipt of satisfactory bid, to enter into a contract for the purchase of the same.

SECTION 2. The the sum of Dollars (\$) be and the same is hereby appropriated from Fund to pay the costs of said acquisition, if made.

SECTION 3. For the reason that the existing police equipment is in unreliable condition and not serviceable, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and, if adopted by two-thirds of all members of Council concurring, shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING A SOLICITOR'S EXPENSE FUND AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas the City of Nelsonville has established an income tax, contemplates issuance of revenue bonds, is now required to proceed in causes in the Municipal Court situate in Athens all of which add to the clerical expense and general expense of the operation of the office of the City Solicitor,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That there be and there hereby is established an allowance in the amount of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) per month, payable to the Solicitor in equal bimonthly payments, to defray costs incurred by the Solicitor for clerical services, books, files, reproduction costs, travel expenses and such other similar items of expense as may be incurred in behalf of the City of Nelsonville, said allowance to become effective 1 January 1969.

SECTION 2. For the reason that costs have already been incurred and it is necessary to keep the programs already started in effect, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by two-thirds of Council, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF PERSONNEL TO OPERATE THE SWIMMING POOL FOR THE YEAR 1969, TO FIX THE COMPENSATION THEREOF AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1 - That the Recreation Commission of the City of Nelsonville be, and it hereby is, authorized and empowered to employ for the season of 1969 the following employees:

1. Pool Recreation Director
2. One Assistant Director
3. Three Life Guards
4. Three Pool Attendants

SECTION 2. The Recreation Commission of the City of Nelsonville is hereby authorized to establish minimum Standards to be met by such employees as in the opinion of the Recreation Commission will best insure the safety of personnel using the City Pool.

SECTION 3. That the compensation of such employees be and it hereby is, established as follows:

For the reason that it is desirable that the Recreation Commission be enabled to establish its program at the earliest possible date, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its passage if approved by two-thirds of all members of Council, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING THE DUTIES OF THE ASSISTANT IN THE WATER DISTRIBUTION DEPARTMENT, FIXING THE SALARY THEREOF AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1. That it shall be the duty of the assistant in the Water Distribution Department

- (a) Replace meters
- (b) Read meters
- (c) Repair meters
- (d) Have sole responsibility for the operation of continual, and accurate cash flow.

(e) To perform such other duties in the Water Department as may be assigned to him

The meters referred to hereinabove are water meters.

SECTION 2. That the salary of the assistant to the Water Distribution Department be and the same hereby is fixed at the rate of Four Hundred and Thirty Dollars and Fifty-Four Cents (\$430.54) per month, said salary to be effective as of 15 October 1968.

SECTION 3. For the reason it has become apparent the duties in the Water Distribution Department are manifestly increased it is necessary to retain competent personnel for the safety of said City, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if passed by two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF SANITATION TRUCKS UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, it has been determined by the Council of the City of Nelsonville that trucks engaged in the hauling of waste, refuse and offal have been stored on occasion on the public streets and that such parking is offensive esthetically and constitutes a hazard to health,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1. That trucks engaged in the business of hauling debris, rubbish, garbage and offal be, and the same hereby are, prohibited from parking for purpose other than loading, on the streets of the City of Nelsonville.

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall, for the first offense, be fined not less than Twenty Dollars and for each subsequent offense not less than Twenty-Five nor more than Fifty Dollars, upon conviction.

SECTION 3. For the reason that the parking of said trucks for storage purposes upon the public streets constitutes a threat to the health of the citizens of Nelsonville and to the sanitary conditions of the streets, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if adopted by two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

For the reason that it has been determined that the prohibiting of parking on the south side of said street manifestly increases the safety of the sue thereof, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public pease, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if adopted by two-thirds of all members elected to Council, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR TO PROCEED BY EMERGENCY PROCEDURE TO ACQUIRE A POLICE CAR FOR THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas on of the patrol vehicles of Police Department of the City of Nelsonville has been demolished and is not susceptible of repair, and

Whereas one patrol car is not adequate with which to police the City of Nelsonville, now, therefore,

SECTION 1. That the Safety and Service Director be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed together with the Chief of Police of the City of Nelsonville to proceed by the most expeditious method possible to acquire for and on behalf of the City a new police patrol car. The Safety and Service Director and Chief of Police are hereby authorized to take bids informally by contacting the several establishments in Athens County that sell suitable vehicles for police use, and, upon determination of the lowest and best bid to enter into a contract therefore.

SECTION 2. For the reason that one police car is not adequate for the safety and protection of the citizens of the City of Nelsonville, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by two-thirds of all members of Council elected thereto concurring otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.



SECTION 1. That Ordinance No. 5-69 be, and the same hereby is, repealed.





BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE


SECTION 1. That the Safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to advertise for a numeric accounting machine to be used in utility billing in accordance with the following specifications:

1. No less than ten accumulating mechanisms
2. Machine must have ability to prepare water bill, update customer ledger, and prepare detail journal with one handling of figures
3. Programs to include:
 - (a) Posting charges
 - (b) Posting payments to customers account
 - (c) Posting to general ledger accounts
4. One year warranty on all parts and labor
5. Ability to be programmed to perform other accounting applications as needs dictates

SECTION 2. For the reason that said machine is necessary in view of changing rates, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by three-fourths of all members elected to Council concur, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING CLEAN WATER CONNECTIONS TO SANITARY SEWERS, FITTING STANDARD FOR SANITARY SEWERS AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE:

SECTION 1. All surface water, rain water from roofs, subsoil drainage, building foundation drainage, cistern overflow, clean water from condensers, waste water from water motors and elevators and any other clean and unobjectionable waste water shall be discharged into a storm water or combined sewer and in no case into a sanitary sewer.

SECTION 2. From and after the date of this Ordinance all new construction of sanitary sewerage systems, including buildings, residences and other connections to sanitary sewer, shall be constructed of premium joint pipe, the use of slip seal pipe being expressly prohibited.

SECTION 3. For the reason that every effort is being made to bring the sewerage system of the City of Nelsonville into compliance with health regulations, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if adopted by three-fourths of all members of Council concurring, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

Whereas, Nelsonville T.V. Cable, Inc. as pursuant to Ordinance 12-65 requested a hearing before this Council on the necessity of a rate increase and this Council, having heard the evidence, is convinced that said request is reasonable, now, therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1. That the base rate as provided in Ordinance 12-65 be and the same hereby is increased to \$4.25 per month, effective 1 December 1969.


SECTION 2. That all other charges provided in said Ordinance 12-65 be, and remain the same.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING SCHEDULE OF RATES FOR THE NELSONVILLE WATER WORKS SYSTEM AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1. That the prices to be charged for water furnished by the City Water Works Department to all consumers situate in the City of Nelsonville, Ohio on all billings payable after the first regular meter reading during the month of December 1969, be and the same are hereby affixed as follows:

SCHEDULE OF RATES: Effective on the 15th day of December 1969, the product and services furnished by the municipal water works system of the City of Nelsonville shall be charged for at the following rates: There is hereby established a quarterly minimum bill of \$8.40 against which the first 6000 gallons used shall be credited.

SCHEDULE A - Metered Service

Class 1 - Except as otherwise provided in Class 2 of this Schedule A, the rates for metered service for public and private use shall be as follows:

For the first 10,000 gallons per quarter	- \$1.40 per 1,000 gallons or part thereof
Next 90,000 gallons per quarter	- \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons or part thereof
Next 400,000 gallons per quarter	- \$.80 per 1,000 gallons or part thereof
All over 500,000 gallons per quarter	- \$.55 per 1,000 gallons or part thereof

The minimum charge for this service shall be in accord with the following schedules:

MINIMUM BILLS - The quarterly minimum billings shall be based upon size of meter installed:

MULTIPLE MINIMUMS: - Where more than one dwelling unit, or occupancy, is served by a single meter, the total bill shall be the basic minimum rate applicable, multiplied by the number of family units or occupancies served, or the calculated water bill for the actual consumption measured, which ever is greater.

For a period of less than one quarter, the minimum charge shall be determined on a per diem pro rate basis in the proportion that the number of days in the quarter bears to 120 days.

Class 2 - Special Contracts:

The rates for water supplied pursuant to a special contract prescribing rates differing from those set forth in Class 1 of this Schedule A shall be determined in accordance with the terms of such contract until other provisions is made therefor.

SCHEDULE B - Non-metered Service

Class 1. Public Fire Protection.

A hydrant rental shall be paid by the City at the rate of \$40 per year for each hydrant not in excess of 50 and \$30 per year for each hydrant in excess of 50, payable semi-annually on June 1 and December 1.

A hydrant rental for all privately owned hydrants, or publicly owned and outside the corporate limits, shall be paid by the owners thereof at the rate of \$40 per year, payable semi-annually on June 1 and December 1.

Class 2. Other non-metered service

The following rates for non-metered service shall be charged for the following specified uses:

For use in the construction of a frame dwelling not exceeding 7 rooms - \$7.00 per month

For use in the construction of a frame dwelling exceeding 7 rooms - \$7.00 plus \$1.00 for each room in excess of seven rooms

For use in the construction of a stone, brick or concrete dwelling not exceeding 7 rooms - \$13.50

For use in the construction of a stone, brick or concrete dwelling exceeding 7 rooms - \$13.50 plus \$2.35 for each room in excess of seven rooms

For filling tanks and tank trucks - \$2.10 for each 1,000 gallons or part thereof

SCHEDULE C - Commencement and Discontinuance of water

A charge of \$2.00 shall be made for shutting off water service at the time of its discontinuance and a similar charge shall be made for turning on such service at the time of the resumption thereof whether or not such discontinuance of water service involves shutting off the water service and subsequent turning it on.


