SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be in effect from and after the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE SALARY SCHEDULE FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, AND REPEALING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That from and after the 1st day of April, 1971, the following salary schedule shall be and hereby is established, providing the remuneration indicated for the employees holding the several offices as hereinafter set forth:

Provided, however, the foregoing rates apply to employees now regularly employed. All new employees shall receive Thirty-Seven Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$37.50) less than the foregoing rate then in effect, provided that upon completion of twelve (12) consecutive months of service, such employee shall receive compensation in accordance with the rates hereinabove set forth, except as to policemen and firemen who shall be governed by the rates heretofore set forth.

SECTION 2. A working week shall consist of forty-four working hours. In the event that in the opinion of a head of a department it is necessary for an employee in his department to work more than forty-four hours per week, such overtime work

shall be compensated at such employee's straight time. In the event in the opinion of the head of the department an employee need not to accomplish his work, work forty-four hours a week, no reduction shall be made in such employee's salary stated above.

Department heads shall be paid overtime for all time worked over forty-four hours per week in accordance with this section, provided, however, this provision with reference to department heads shall be reviewed at the end of one year.

SECTION 3. The City will pay Blue Cross Insurance Protection for all regular City Employees who earn Two Hundred and Nine Dollars or more per month up to the sum of Sixteen Dollars and Two Cents premium payment monthly. In the event the premium costs exceeds Sixteen Dollars and Two Cents per month, such additional premium shall be paid by the employees.

SECTION 4. (a) A uniform allowance is hereby established for the Police Department at One Hundred and Twenty-Five Dollars per man per year. (b) The uniform allowance for new employees of the Police Department is hereby established at One Hundred and Fifty Dollars, providing, however, the said initial uniform allowance shall be allowed to two men per year of the said Police Department only.

SECTION 5. A uniform allowance be, and the same is hereby established at One Hundred Dollars per man per year for the Fire Department.

SECTION 6. Each regular employee is allowed sick leave in accordance with the Revised Code of Ohio.

SECTION 7. Each regular employee is entitled to one (1) week of vacation after the first year of employment. Thereafter vacation time shall accrue one day of vacation for each year, exclusive of the first, of service until five years of service when two weeks of vacation is established. After ten years of service an employee shall be entitled to three weeks of vacation.

Vacations are to be taken when scheduled, are not cumulative and failure to take vacation time shall not obligate the City to payment for time worked in lieu thereof, nor shall any employee take more than three (3) consecutive weeks of vacation.

Firemen and policemen shall be governed in vacation policy by the Ohio Revised Code Sections applicable.

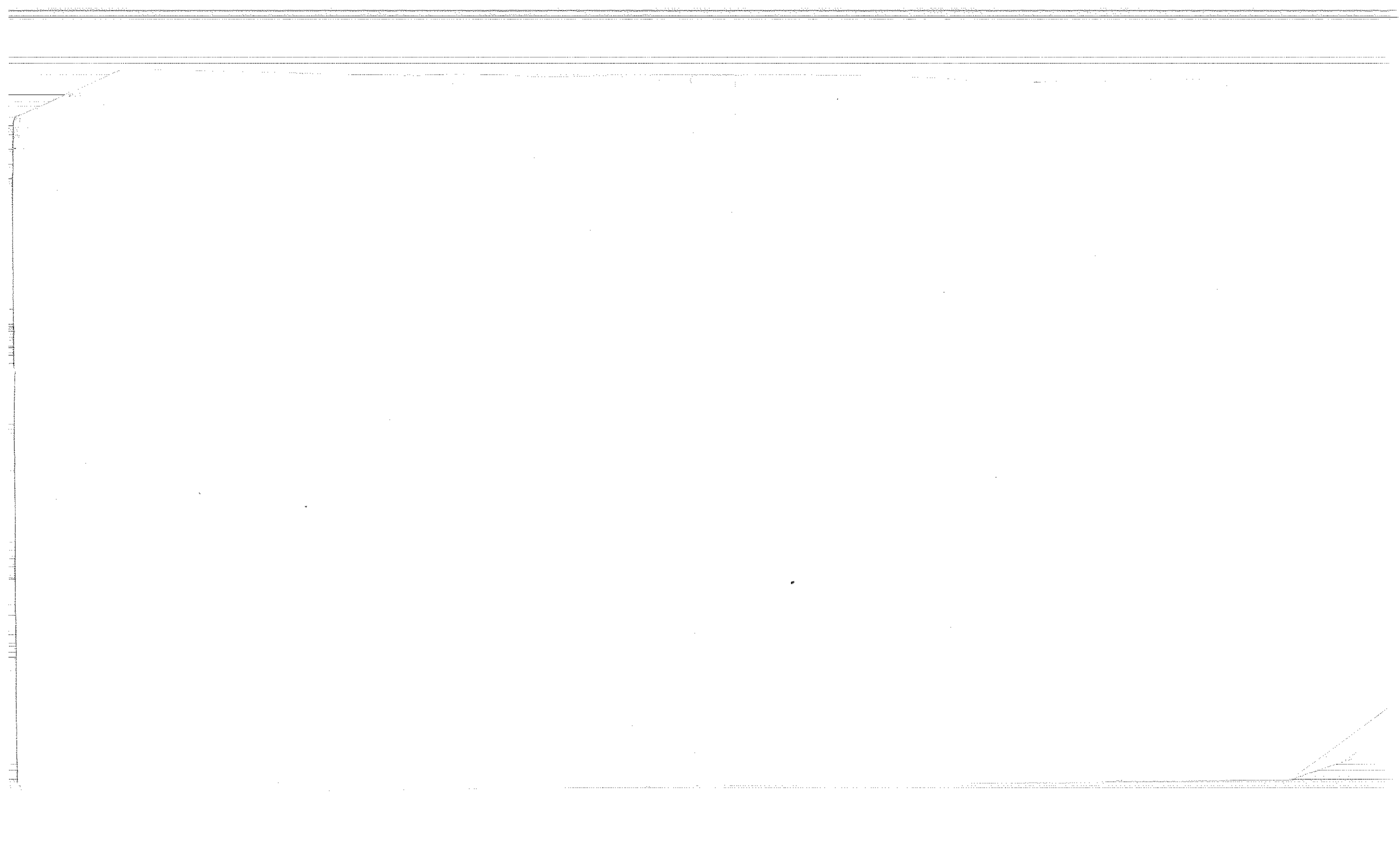
SECTION 8. Any employee required to work on New Year's Day, Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day may elect to take compensatory time off or to be paid. Such payment will be made in the current pay period.

The head of the department shall direct such time of work and certify a record thereof with respect to the elections and hours worked of departmental employees affected to the Service Director and Auditor.

SECTION 9. Any patrolman or fireman having two (2) years consecutive service in the same department, may at the option of the chief of his department, be promoted to Senior Patrolman or Senior Fireman.

At any time the position of Senior Patrolman or Senior Fireman becomes vacant and there is no patrolman or fireman eligible for the promotion, the chief of his department may at his option fill the position of Senior Patrolman or Senior Fireman with a Patrolman or Fireman having one year (1) consecutive service in his department.


SECTION 10. The Chief of the Fire Department shall make regular in-



spection for the safety of the City. The Chief and Senior Fireman and all Firemen on duty on their respective shifts shall assist in the office of the Police Department and shall perform such other duties consistent with his position as are prescribed from time to time by the Service Director. All Firemen shall attend fire school one week each year and shall receive for his expenses while in attendance thereat, a sum of Twenty-Five Dollars in addition to his regular salary.

In addition to the foregoing duties, the said Chief of the Fire Department shall during the periods he is on duty act as custodian of the Police and Fire Departments and the City Jail.

SECTION 11. All ordinances, resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed.



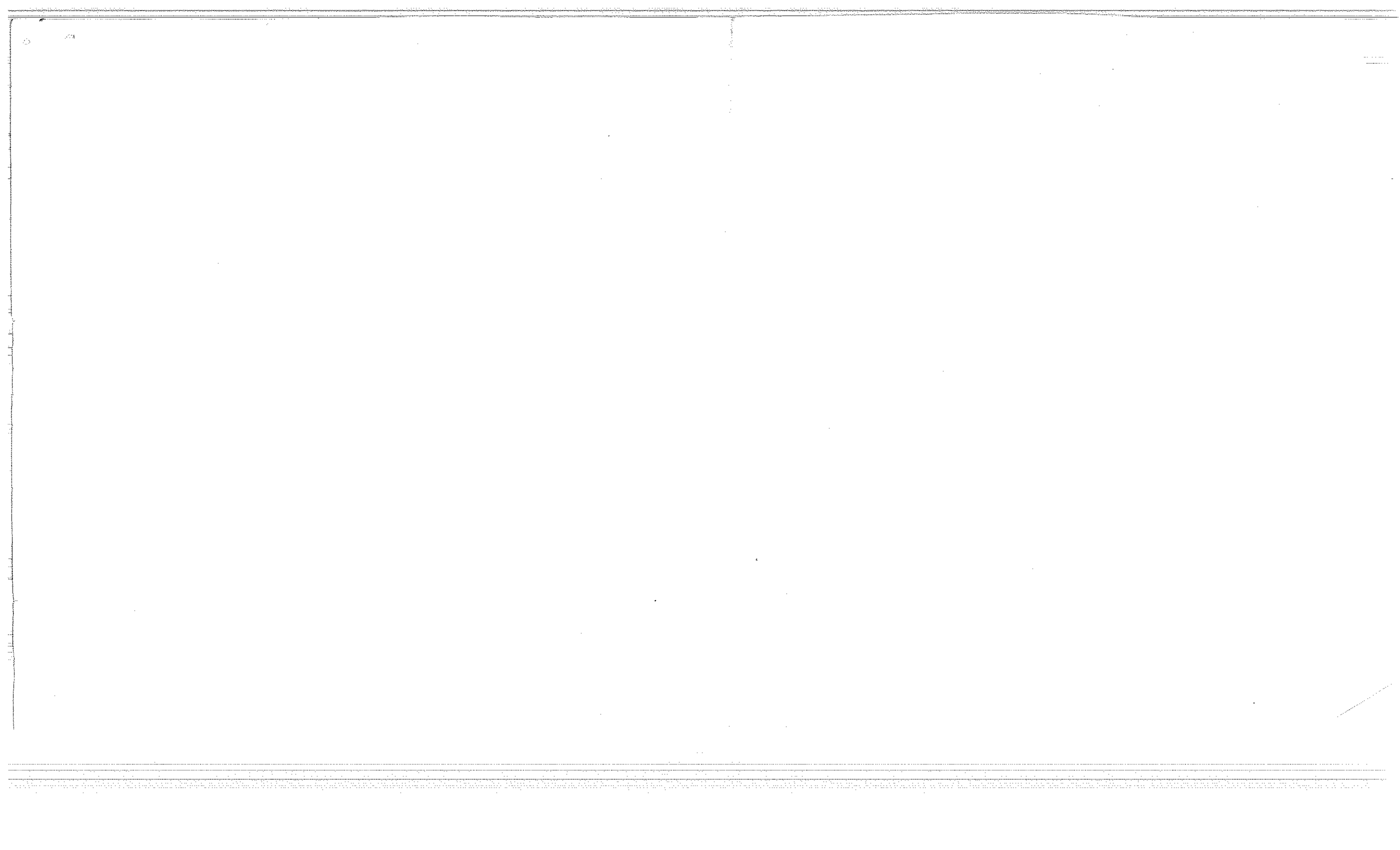

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE RATE OF COMPENSATION OF THE SAFETY AND SERVICE DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, AND REPEALING INCONSISTENT ORDINANCES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO

SECTION 1. That from and after the effective date of this Ordinance the rate of compensation of the Safety and Service Director of the City of Nelsonville shall be Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$350.00) per month for the first six months of service and thereafter at the rate of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) per month, said salary to be paid bi-monthly as other items of City Salary, provided, however, that the salary of the present Safety and Service Director remains at Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) per month.

SECTION 2. That all ordinances, resolutions and parts thereof that are inconsistent with SECTION 1 hereof, be and the same hereby are repealed.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE RULES, REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO, MUNICIPAL WATERWORKS SYSTEM.

Whereas, the City of Nelsonville, Athens County, Ohio, hereinafter called the municipality has undertaken to construct a municipal waterworks system; and

Whereas, the municipality contemplates financing the acquisition of the waterworks system pursuant to the sale of bonds and has adopted a schedule of rates and charges heretofore,

Now, therefore, be it ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO, as follows:

1. Property owner or his agent, hereinafter called customer, must make written application for water service at the City office of the municipality, and said application including service received thereunder is unassignable by the customer.
2. All taps and connections to the mains of the municipality shall be made by and/or under the direction and supervision of waterworks personnel.
3. The municipality shall install and maintain at its expense that portion of the service from the main to the lot or easement line, including the necessary tap, fittings, and shut-off valve; and the customer shall install and maintain at its expense that portion of the service from said lot or easement line to his premises, including a stop and waste cock at the end of the house side of his service. The minimum earth cover of the customer's service shall be five (5) feet. The Company shall determine the size and kind of service to be installed.
4. Application may be cancelled and/or water service discontinued by the municipality for any violation of any rule, regulation or condition of service, and especially for any of the following reasons:
 - (a) Misrepresentation in the application as to the property or fixtures to be supplied or use to be made of water.
 - (b) Failure to report to the municipality addition to the property or fixtures to the supplies or additional use to be made of water.
 - (c) Resale or giving away of water.
 - (d) Waste or misuse of water due to improper or imperfect service pipes, and/or fixtures, or failure to keep same in suitable state of repair.
 - (e) Tampering with meter, meter seal, service, or valves, or permitting such tampering by others.
 - (f) Connection, cross-connection, or permitting same, of any separate water supply to premises which receive water from the municipality.
 - (g) Non-payment of bills.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 17-67 AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That from and after the effective date of this Ordinance paragraphs 2 and 3 of Section 13 of Ordinance No. 17-67 be and they hereby are amended to read as follows:

Paragraph 2. Not more than forty (40) percent of net available income tax receipts received annually shall be used to defray operating expenses of the City.

Paragraph 3. At least sixty (60) percent of net available income tax receipts received annually shall be set aside and used for capital improvements for the City including, but not limited to, development and construction of storm sewers and stree improvements; for public buildings, parks and playgrounds; and for equipment necessary for the police, fire, street, traffic and safety departments.

SECTION 2. For the reason that the revenues generated by the income tax are required to meet increased operating costs and wages forthwith, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary to the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by three fourths of all members elected to Council concurring, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas the Ohio Water Pollution Control Board has required the City of Nelsonville to construct certain additions and betterments to the existing sewerage plant and collection system, and

Whereas in order to comply with said directions and instructions it is necessary that the City of Nelsonville borrow money in order to finance the cost of said improvements, and

Whereas the existing sewer rates are inadequate to support the cost of retirement of said loan, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1. That the following rates be and they hereby are established as amended rates for the sewerage system users and those amenable to the ordinance heretofore passed with reference thereto:

The first 3,300 gallons per month at 75¢ per thousand gallons

The next 30,000 gallons per month at 32¢ per thousand gallons

All over 33,300 gallons per month at 15¢ per thousand gallons

Commercial rate over 35,000 gallons per month at 5¢ per thousand gallons

Monthly minimum rate \$1.30

SECTION 2. The effective date of this rate increase shall be the 25th day of June, 1971.

SECTION 3. For the reason that the increased rate is necessary in order to obtain the necessary financing at the favorable rates of interest now extant, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by three-fourths of all members elected to Council concurring, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

SECTION 3. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of said City and for the further reason that the immediate construction of said improvement is necessary to provide for a potable water for the residents of the City, this ordinance shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by three-fourths of all members elected to Council concurring, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF WASTE WATER FACILITY BETWEEN THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE AND THE OHIO WATER DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

Whereas the City of Nelsonville (hereinafter referred to as the "LGA") is under orders from the Ohio Water Pollution Control Board to construct certain waste water facilities as specified in said orders not later than December 31, 1974; and


Whereas, the LGA desires to cooperate with the Ohio Water Development Authority (hereinafter referred to as the "OWDA") in the construction, maintenance and operation of such facilities through the program of the OWDA instituted by the adoption of amended H. B. 828 by the 108th General Assembly of the State of Ohio under the provisions, terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

Whereas, the OWDA has stated its desire to cooperate in the construction, maintenance and operation of such facilities under the provisions, terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the LGA hereby approves the construction, maintenance and operation of the aforesaid waste water facilities in cooperation with the OWDA under the provisions, terms and conditions set forth in the "Cooperative Agreement for Construction, Maintenance and Operation of Waste Water Facilities" as set forth in Exhibit A and hereby authorizes the Chief Executive and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the City of Nelsonville to execute such an agreement with the OWDA substantially in the form set forth in Exhibit A.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare for the reason that the immediate construction of the waste water facilities at the earliest possible time is necessary in order to protect the health of the inhabitants of the LGA by providing adequate disposition of waste water; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately after its passage if adopted by three-fourths of all members elected to Council concurring, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law, and approval by the Mayor.



AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SEWER RATE FOR SEWAGE FROM THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TRI COUNTY VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

Whereas, the City of Nelsonville and the Board of Education of the Joint Vocational and Technical Institute of Tri County School District, have heretofore entered into a contract under the terms of which each of the parties was to furnish one-half of the cost of said sewage system, and

Whereas, said contract, further provided for the recovery of said expenditure on behalf of the City of Nelsonville by rates predicated upon engineering estimates of usage and,

Whereas, said usage has fallen substantially below the amount estimated and the notes issued by the City of Nelsonville cannot be retired from the revenues from said sewage system and,

Whereas, said notes provide for retirement pursuant to the income from revenues from said portion of the system, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE

SECTION 1. That the rate for sewage removal to be charged to the Board of Education of the Tri-County Joint Vocational High School, be, and the same here is fixed at the sum of One Hundred Ten Dollars (\$110.00) per month, said rate is to remain in effect until such time as the notes payable to the First National Bank of Nelsonville and The Peoples Bank of Nelsonville be retired from revenues, after which time said rates shall be renegotiated.

SECTION 2. For the reason that interest has only been paid on the two (2) notes and the rate is presently inadequate to retire said notes and it is desired to proceed to the retirement of said notes, and to continue the sewage service to the Tri-County Joint Vocational School, this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the public peace, health and safety and shall take effect forthwith upon its adoption if approved by three-fourths of all members elected to Council concurring otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.
