PERTAINING TO COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT DEVICES, AND THE LICENSE FEES CHARGED THEREFORE, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1 That Section 311.02 of the Business Regulation Code of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, adopted pursuant to Ordinance 1145 and Ordinance 2-76 amending the same, be and they are hereby amended so as to require that the license permitting the exhibition of coin operated amusement devices shall be issued only upon payment of a license fee of \$50.00, in advanced, in the event that the device requires a coin value greater than one penny to operate each said machine.


SECTION 2. That all licenses issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be posted in a prominent place in the building housing the device or machine.

SECTION 3. That Section 311.05 of Ordinance 1145, and Ordinance 2-76 amending the same, be and they are hereby amended to read as follows:


The Chief of Police of the City of Nelsonville be, and he is hereby authorized and empowered to collect the license fee provided for herein.


SECTION 4. For the reason that it is desired forthwith adjust the license fee to represent the cost of policing, each license fee shall extend from April 15 to the succeeding April 15 of each year.

SECTION 5. This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, welfare, public peace and safety of the residents of the City of Nelsonville; and that it shall be in effect and full force upon its approval by two-thirds of all members elected to council concurring and signed by the mayor, otherwise at the earliest period permitted by law.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$30,000.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE PATCHING, SEALING, LIMESTONING, GRADING, AND DITCHING OF SYLVANIA AVENUE, COUNTY ROAD 5, MUDSOCK ROAD, FORT STREET, POPLAR STREET, DORR RUN ROAD, COLUMBUS STREET, MYERS STREET, CANAL STREET, FRANKLIN STREET, MILL STREET, FAYETTE STREET, AND SOUTH HARPER STREET, AND FOR THE INSTALLATION OF A GUARD RAIL ON MASON CITY HILL, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, STATE OF OHIO.

SECTION I. That the sum of \$30,000.00 be and it is hereby appropriated from the capital improvement fund for the patching, sealing, limestoning, grading and ditching of Sylvania Avenue, County Road 5, Mudsock Road, Fort Street, Poplar Street, Dorr Run Road, Columbus Street, Myers Street, Canal Street, Franklin Street, Mill Street, Fayette Street, and South Harper Street and for the installation of a guard rail on Mason City Hill.

If none of the parties can be located, or if none of the parties' addresses can be ascertained, then this notice shall be deemed to be properly served if a copy thereof is placed in a conspicuous place on or about the building or structure affected by this notice. If such notice is by certified mail, the 30 day period within which the owners are required to comply with the order of the Service Director shall begin as of the date when the return receipt is signed by any of the above-specified parties or by a member of the addressee's family.

SECTION FOUR: Posting of Signs. The Service Director shall cause to be posted at each entrance of such unsafe building a notice which states as follows:

"DO NOT ENTER. UNSAFE TO OCCUPY. OFFICE OF SERVICE DIRECTOR, CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO."

This notice shall remain posted until the required repairs are made or demolition is completed. It shall be unlawful for any person to remove such notice without permission of the Service Director or for any person to enter the building, except for the purpose of making the required repairs or of demolishing the structure.

SECTION FIVE: Rights to Hearing. The owner of record, or the purchaser under a land contract, may, within 10 days after completion of service of notice of unsafe building, make a demand in writing to the Service Director for a hearing on the question of whether an unsafe building, as defined in Section One, exists. The hearing shall be given to the owner of record or the purchaser under a land contract. The hearing shall be conducted by a hearing board composed of the Mayor, the President of Council, who shall preside at the hearing, and the City council-person elected in the ward in which the premises in question are located. All members of the hearing board must concur that an

A copy of the decision of the hearing officers shall be promptly served upon the owners of record or the purchaser under a land contract in the manner provided for in Section Three.

SECTION SIX: Right to Demolish. In case the owner of record, or the purchaser under a land contract if that be the case, shall fail, neglect, or refuse to comply with the notice to repair, rehabilitate or demolish and remove such building or structure or portion thereof, such party, either the owner of record or the purchaser under a land contract, shall be subject to the penal provisions of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio. The Service Director shall then proceed to have the building or structure or portion thereof demolished and removed from the premises, leaving the premises in a clean, safe, and sanitary condition. The cost of this work shall be paid by the City. If the City is not immediately reimbursed for this cost, the amount thereof shall be certified to the County Treasurer and levied as a special assessment against the property on which the building or structure is located and shall be collected in the manner provided for special assessments, all pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 715.261.

SECTION SEVEN: Unsafe Conditions; Reports. Any owner, manager, lessee, or occupant of a building who discovers or who has reason to believe that there exists on the premises a condition which may endanger other property or the life or limb of any person, and that such condition cannot be immediately remedied, shall, within twenty-four hours after such discovery report the existence of such dangerous condition to the Service Director. If the Service Director cannot be located, such report shall be made to the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 535 OF THE GENERAL OFFENSE CODE OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO (ORDINANCE NUMBER ¹⁻⁵⁵ ~~1-55~~) TO INCLUDE AND ESTABLISH SECTION 535.17, ENTITLED "USING PROPERTY TO DISTURB THE PEACE" WITHIN CHAPTER 535 AND TO DECLARE IT AN EMERGENCY.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, State of Ohio:

Section 535.17 be and it is hereby established and included in Chapter 535 of the General Offense Code of Nelsonville, Ohio, Ordinance Number 1-55 to read as follows:

Section 535.17 "USING PROPERTY TO DISTURB THE PEACE"

- (a) No person who owns, rents, leases, or has control of or possession of any lot, business, property, house, rental unit, house trailer, mobile home, room, apartment, or any other vehicle or place used for human habitation, shall negligently allow said lot, business, property, house, rental unit, house trailer, mobile home, room, apartment, or any other place or vehicle used for human habitation to be used in a manner which produces or disseminates unreasonable noises or in a manner that breaches the peace of the neighborhood in which it is located.
- (b) It shall be PRIMA FACIE evidence of using property to disturb the peace when a police officer, in a good faith effort to enforce this section, notifies the offender that, in the police officer's judgment, the offender is producing or disseminating unreasonable noises or is breaching the peace of the neighborhood and the offender, once notified, continues producing or disseminating unreasonable noises or breaches the peace of the neighborhood after such notice by the police officer.
- (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to zone the use of property or land to certain uses.
- (d) Whoever violates this section is guilty of using property to disturb the peace, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree.
- (e) This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio for the reason that there is no ordinance which prohibits using property to disturb the peace and several offenders have been using property to disturb the peace within the community and thus this measure is declared to be an emergency measure and it will take effect upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

This measure is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Nelsonville, Ohio for the reason that the existing police cruisers used by the City Police Department are in a deteriorated condition and therefore, this measure is declared to meet a real and present emergency arising in connection with the operation and maintenance of the City Police Department and this measure shall therefore take effect upon its passage by two thirds vote of all of the members elected to this City Council and subsequent approval by the Mayor.





An emergency ordinance enacted by the City of Nelsonville, Athens County, Ohio, in the matter of the hereinafter described improvement, under the supervision of the Director of Transportation.

WHEREAS, the Director of Transportation is considering improving a portion of the public highway which is described as follows:

The project on State Route No. 278 (Lake Hope Drive) begins 0.13 mile, more or less, southwest of the junction of US 33 and SR 278; thence, in a northeasterly direction across the Hocking River for a distance of 0.11 mile, more or less, and there terminate

The project consists of replacing the existing narrow and functionally obsolete bridge over the Hocking River on basically the same alignment and grade, and providing all other necessary incidentals needed to complete the project. Traffic will be maintained during construction.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio:

SECTION I (Consent)

That it is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of said City be and such consent is hereby given to the Director of Transportation to construct the above described improvement, in accordance with plans, specifications and estimates as approved by the Director.

SECTION II (Cooperation)

That said City hereby proposes to cooperate with the State of Ohio, in the cost of the above described improvement as follows:

Financial participation, by the City to the State, will not be required.

SECTION III (Authority to Sign)

That the Safety-Service Director of said City is hereby empowered and directed on behalf of the City to enter into agreements with the Director of Transportation necessary to complete the planning and construction of this improvement.

SECTION IV (Traffic Control Signals and Devices)

That traffic control signals will not be installed on the project without prior approval by the State.

SECTION V (Maintenance and Parking)

That ~~the~~ provision of said improvement, said City, ~~will thereafter keep~~ said highway open to traffic at all times, and

(a) Maintain the improvement in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto and make ample financial and other provisions for such maintenance; and

(b) Maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstructions in a manner satisfactory to the State of Ohio and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes and permit no signs, posters, billboards, roadside stands or other private installations within the right-of-way limits; and

(c) Place and maintain all traffic control devices conforming to the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices on the improvement in compliance with the provisions of Section 4511.11 and related sections of the Ohio Revised Code.

(d) Regulate parking in the following manner:

Prohibit parking on the project at all times.

SECTION VI (Right-of-Way, Utility Rearrangement and Saving the State of Ohio Harmless of Damages)

(a) That all existing street and public way right-of-way within the City which is necessary for the aforesaid improvement, shall be made available therefor.

(b) That the State will acquire any additional right-of-way required for the construction of the aforesaid improvement.

(c) That arrangements have been or will be made with and agreements obtained from all public utility companies whose lines or structures will be affected by the said improvement and said companies have agreed to make any and all necessary plant removals or rearrangements in such a manner as to be clear of any construction called for by the plans of said improvement and said companies have agreed to make such necessary rearrangements immediately after notification by said City or the Department of Transportation.

(d) That it is hereby agreed that the City shall at its own expense, make all rearrangements of water mains, service lines, fire hydrants, valve boxes, sanitary sewers or other municipally owned utilities and/or any appurtenances thereto, which do not comply with the provisions of Directive 28-A, whether inside or outside the corporate limits as may be necessary to conform to the said improvement and said rearrangements shall be done at such time as requested by the Department of Transportation Engineer.

(e) That the construction, reconstruction, and/or rearrangement of both publicly and privately owned utilities, referred to in subsections (c) and (d) above, shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere unduly with the operation of the contractor constructing the improvement and all backfilling of trenches made necessary by such utility rearrangements shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications and shall be subject to approval by the State.

(f) That the installation of all utility facilities on the right of way shall conform with the requirements of the Federal Highway Administration Policy and Procedure Memorandum 30-4 "Utility Relocations and Adjustments" and the Department of Transportation's rules on Utility Accommodation.

(g) That said City hereby agrees that the said Department of Transportation of the State of Ohio, shall be and is hereby saved harmless from any and all damages or claims thereof arising from or growing out of the certificate or obligations made or agreed to in Sections (a), (b), (c), (d) and (e) hereinabove.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING OR TRANSFERRING \$300.00 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE MAYOR'S ADMINISTRATIVE ACCOUNT, TRANSFERRING OR APPROPRIATING \$3,000.00 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE RECREATION FUND FOR CURRENT EXPENSES, TRANSFERRING OR APPROPRIATING \$1,000.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE PURPOSES OF ACQUIRING A TRAILER FOR THE STREET DEPARTMENT, TRANSFERRING OR APPROPRIATING \$1,800.00 FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE ACQUISITION AND INSTALLATION OF INSULATION FOR THE CITY HALL, APPROPRIATING \$1,500.00 FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO COMPENSATE THE ASSISTANT LAW DIRECTOR FOR THE MONTHS OF OCTOBER, NOVEMBER, AND DECEMBER 1982, APPROPRIATING \$1,100.00 FROM THE SEWER FUND FOR THE PURPOSES OF ACQUIRING A STORAGE BUILDING, APPROPRIATING \$800.00 FROM THE WATER FUND FOR THE PURPOSES OF ACQUIRING A BUILDING FOR THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT, TRANSFERRING \$1,500.00 FROM THE WATER DISTRIBUTION FUND TO THE WATER OFFICE FUND FOR OPERATING EXPENSES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, State of Ohio:

1. That \$300.00 be and it is hereby appropriated or transferred from the General Fund to the Mayor's Administrative Account.
2. That \$3,000.00 be and it is hereby appropriated or transferred from the General fund to the Recreation Fund for current expenses.
3. That \$1,000.00 be and it is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement fund for the purposes of acquiring a trailer for the street department.
4. That \$1,800.00 be and it is hereby appropriated from the Capital Improvement Fund for the purposes of acquiring and installing insulation for Nelsonville City Hall.
5. That \$1,500.00 be and it is hereby appropriated from the General Fund for the assistant law director for the months of October, November, and December, 1982.
6. That \$1,100.00 be and it is hereby appropriated from the Sewer Fund for the purposes of acquiring a storage building.
7. That \$800.00 be and it is hereby appropriated from the Water Fund for the purposes of acquiring a building for the water treatment plant.
8. That \$1,500.00 be and it is hereby transferred from the Water Distribution Fund to the Water Office fund for the purposes of paying current operating expenses for the months of November and December, 1982.
