ANNUAL APPROPRIATE ORDINANCE

Be it ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio to make appropriations for Current Expenses and other Expenditures of the City of Nelsonville, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1995.

SECTION 1: BE IT RESOLVED BY the Council of the City of Nelsonville, State of Ohio, that, to provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Nelsonville during the fiscal year ending December 31, 1995, the following sums be and they are hereby set aside and appropriated as follows:

WHEREAS, URS Consultants, Inc.-Ohio has successfully obtained OPWC 86% Grant Funding for the Emergency Storm Sewer project according to Resolution #1928.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

SECTION 1

URS Consultants, Inc.-Ohio is hereby authorized to proceed with the proposal dated December 8, 1994.


SECTION 11

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING NELSONVILLE CITY COUNCIL TO ADJUST THE DECLINING SEWER RATES IN THE CITY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, WHEREAS, that it is necessary to adjust the sewer rates for the sewer customers of the City of Nelsonville due to the increased costs and improvements of said system which need to be made.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, that;

SECTION ONE

There exists a necessity to adjust the declining sewer rates for the sewer customers of the City of Nelsonville due to improvements and increased costs. Said increases shall be as follows;

Minimum to 1,500 gallons	\$4.95	
1,501 to 9,000 gallons	\$3.29	per 1,000 gallons of water used
9,001 to 50,000 gallons	\$3.29	per 1,000 gallons of water used
50,001 and over gallons	\$3.29	per 1,000 gallons of water used

said sewer rates for customers outside of Nelsonville City limits will be one (1) and one half (1/2) times those rates charged inside the Nelsonville City limits.

SECTION TWO

This ordinance specifically amends Ordinance No. 23-85 enacted on February 16, 1986.

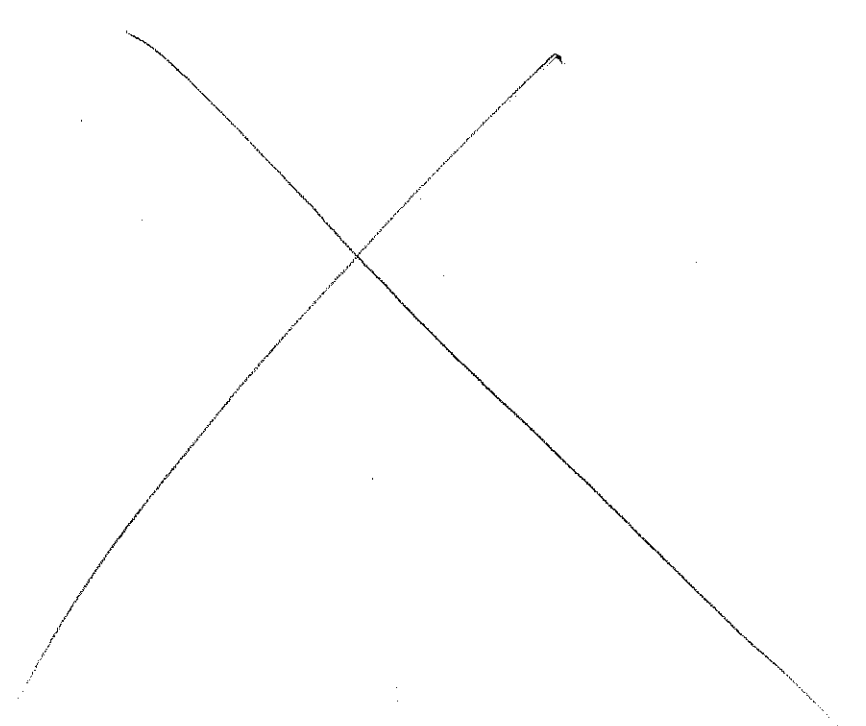

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A PERPETUAL EASEMENT TO THE TRUSTEES OF THE UNITED PENTECOSTAL CHURCH OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO: WHEREAS, the Trustees of the United Pentecostal Church of Nelsonville, aka Trustees of the Pentecostal Gospel Mission Church, aka Trustees of the Nelsonville United Pentecostal Church own property adjacent to Jackson Street in City of Nelsonville, Ohio, upon which the Trustees intend to construct a new sanctuary for their Church; and

WHEREAS, The Trustees require a seven (7) foot easement over and across Jackson Street in the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, (the complete legal description of the requested easement being attached hereto and marked Exhibit "A") for the purpose of the construction of the sanctuary, which will not interfere with pedestrian or vehicular traffic on Jackson Street.

Now, therefore, being Ordained by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, State of Ohio.

That a perpetual easement over and across the legal description described in the attached Exhibit "A" across Jackson Street in the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, be and is hereby granted unto the Trustees of the United Pentecostal Church of Nelsonville, aka Trustees of the Pentecostal Gospel Mission Church, aka Trustees of the Nelsonville United Pentecostal Church, and the City Manager is authorized to execute an easement, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" to said Trustees.

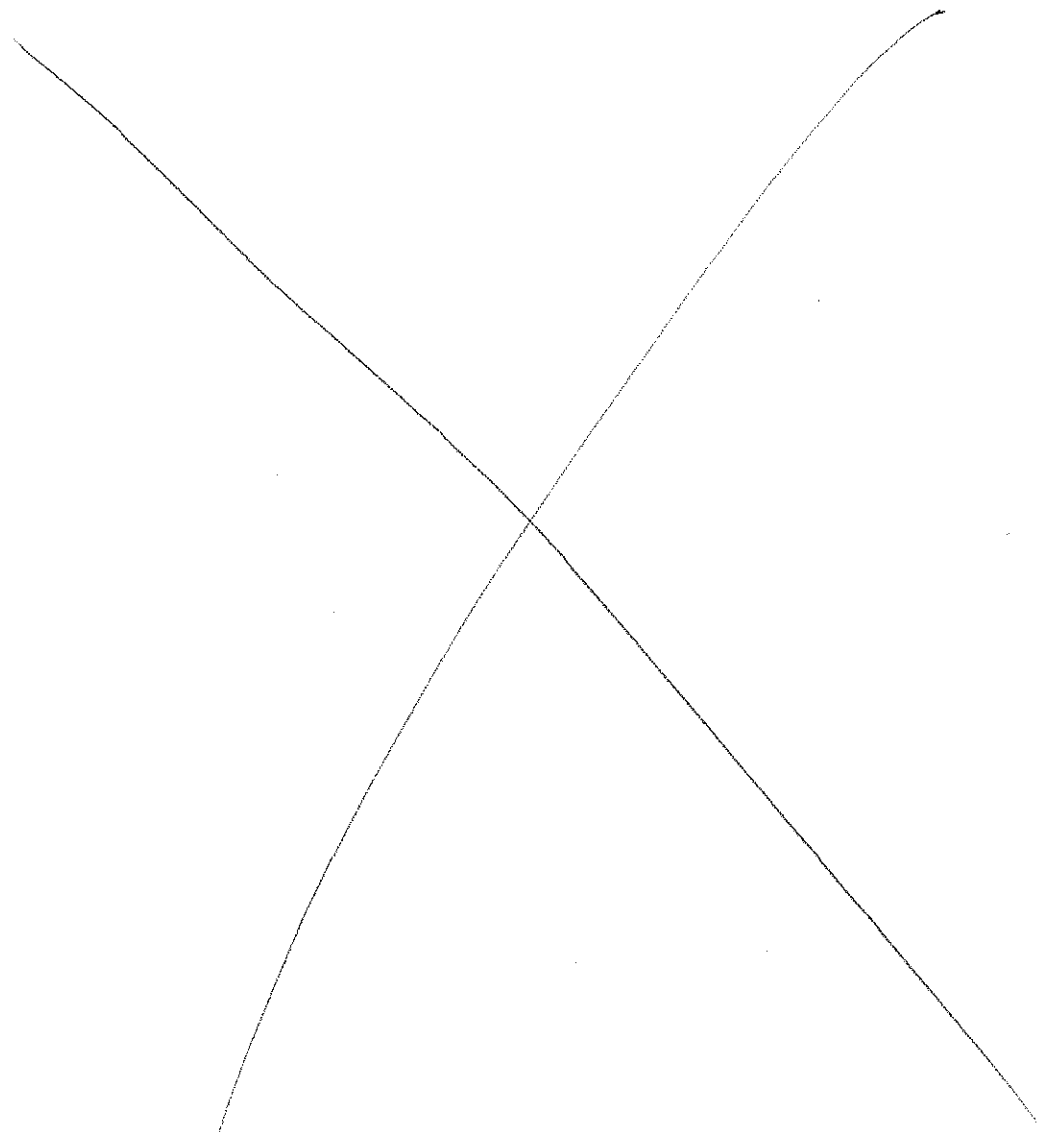

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AN ORDINANCE CREATING A DRUG ENFORCEMENT FUND

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO, WHEREAS, all mandatory Drug Fines imposed by the Courts pursuant to Section 2925.03 of the Ohio Revised Code and designated for the Nelsonville Police Department shall be paid over to the Nelsonville Police Department Drug Enforcement Fund upon receipt from the Clerks of Court.

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, State of Ohio:

SECTION I-That there is hereby created a Drug Enforcement Fund for the purpose of receiving mandatory fines imposed by the Courts.

SECTION-II--Pursuant to ORC 2925.03, mandatory drug fines distributed to the Drug Enforcement Fund shall be allocated only to the Nelsonville Police Department. These funds shall be expended only for the purpose of subsidizing law enforcement efforts of the Nelsonville Police Department pertaining to drug offenses.

SECTION III-That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption and approval.

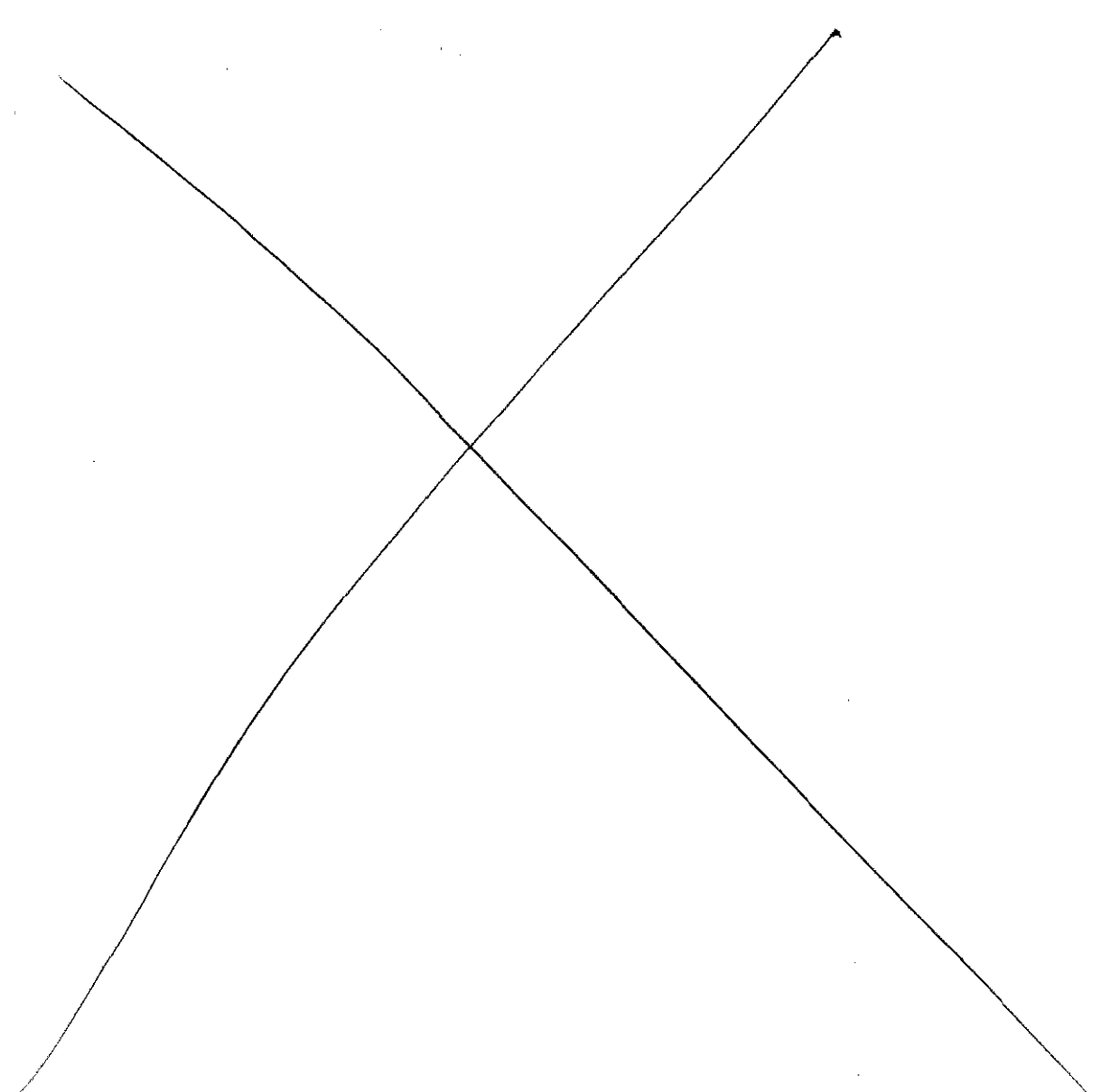

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, Whereas; The City of Nelsonville has a current and on going situation at it's water and sewer plants relative to sludge by-products.


And Whereas; Mr. Eric Brooks has advanced the City a proposal to dispose of this sludge in a proper and accepted manner.

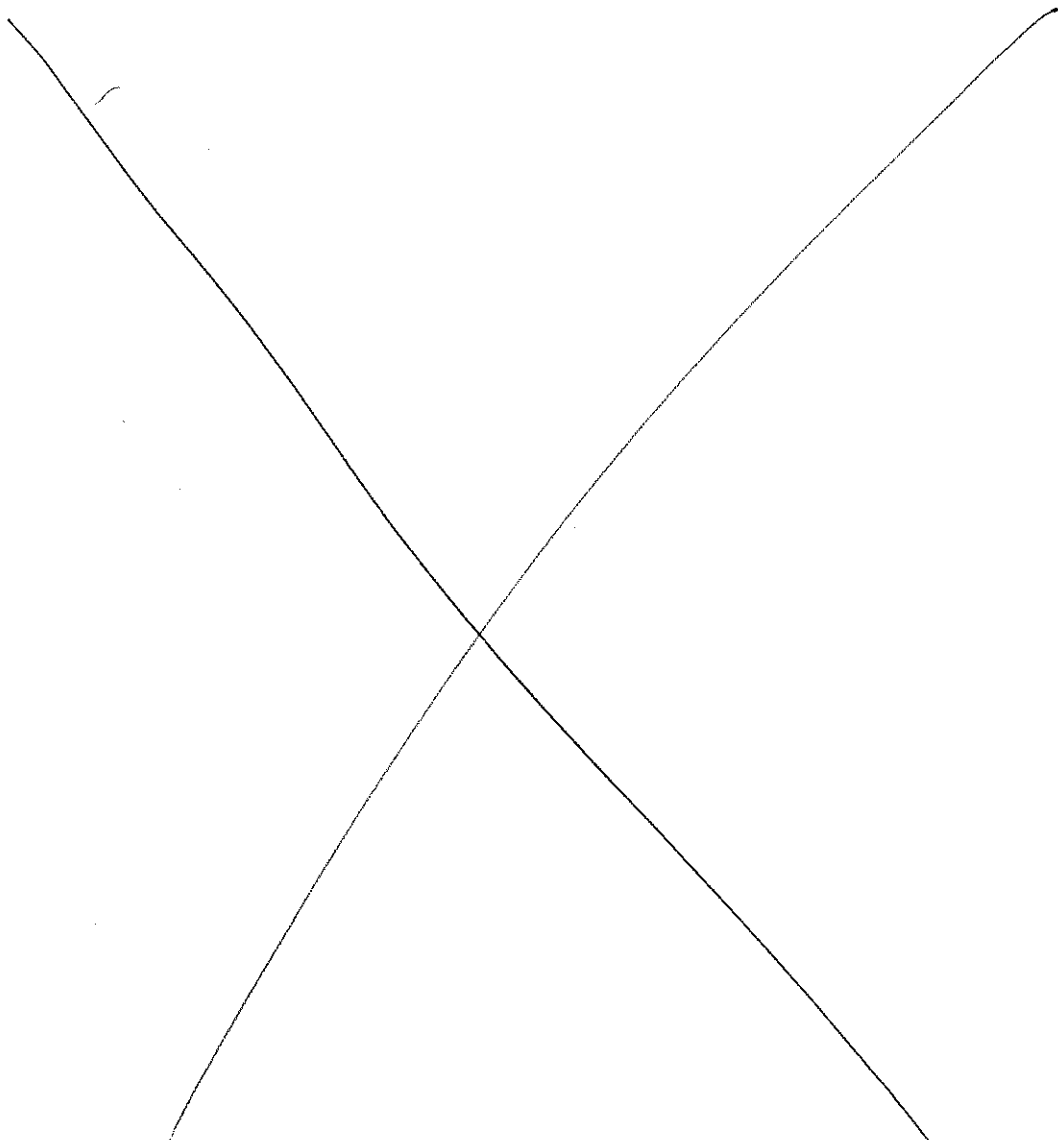

ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO COIN OPERATED DEVICES, EARMARKING THE LICENSE FEES CHARGED AND REVENUES DERIVED THEREFROM AND AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBERS 7-76, 2-82 AND 1145.

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 2-76, Ordinance No. 1145 and Ordinance 2-82, the City of Nelsonville provided for the payment of a license fee for coin operated devices in the amended amount of \$50.00 per license, but did not specifically provide that such revenues be earmarked for the City Recreation Fund, and

WHEREAS, Council wishes to keep the license fee the same, but specifically earmark such revenues for use by the City Recreation fund;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In all respects except as specified herein, said prior Ordinances and Amendments thereto remain in full force and effect, and are by these presents hereby amended;





ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING ENTERING INTO A CONTRACT TO PROVIDE SERVICES OF THE NELSONVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT, TO COVER THE COST OF THE SAME, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Nelsonville incurs certain costs and expenses, when dispatching LEADS Law Enforcement Identification Services, DUI testing, and Court appearances required due to DUI testing, and

1. The fees are required to reimburse the City of Nelsonville for the following services are hereby determined to be necessary to continue provide such services;
2. \$125.00 per month shall be charged for dispatching services, or an exchange for similar services from the recipients;
3. \$5.00 per DUI test or exchange for similar services from the receiving agency;
4. Fees charged for the officer required to appear in Court, shall be the officers's actual pay rate for overtime to be reimbursed to the City of Nelsonville after the officer turns in such time on his time sheets;
5. The President of Council, the City Clerk and the City Manager are authorized to enter into a Contract with agencies requesting such services upon the Fee Schedule as determined herein;
7. All deliberations resulting in the passage of this Ordinance were conducted in open meetings of Council, and all deliberations of Council that resulted in such action were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code;

ORDINANCE TRANSFERRING MONIES FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE STREET CONSTRUCTION FUND, THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND AND THE STREET LEVY FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The Street Construction, the State Highway Fund, and the Street Levy Fund are underfunded by \$21,000, \$18,200 and \$19,100, respectively, to meet projected expenses for the current year, and


WHEREAS, The General Fund has sufficient funds to transfer such sums to said funds.

3. ~~WHEREAS~~ the City of Nelsonville (hereinafter "CITY") is in need of a Law Director and City

Attorney, and

WHEREAS, the Interim Nelsonville City Manager has recommended and Nelsonville City Council has approved, the appointment of Frank A. Lavelle, Esq., to the position of City Law Director for a two (2) year period; and

WHEREAS, by these presents the parties wish to specify the terms of said Agreement and the remuneration for services rendered hereunder;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY MUTUALLY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN FRANK A. LAVELLE, ESQ., LAVELLE LAW OFFICES, L.P.A. AND THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO, AS FOLLOWS:

1. The CITY shall pay Frank A. Lavelle the sum of \$500.00 per month, as well as all employer payroll costs incidental thereto including Employer PERS contributions;
2. In consideration thereof, Frank A. Lavelle shall attend Council Meetings as requested by Council (unless excused therefrom), provide general legal advice and legal research to City Council, its officers and City Manager, draft legal documents, Resolutions, Ordinances and Contracts, perform such other tasks as shall reasonably be requested by the CITY and Council, and shall generally perform the duties of City Law Director as defined in Sec. 6.05 of the Nelsonville City Charter.
3. The said Frank A. Lavelle, Esq. shall have no responsibility, however, for the prosecution of criminal cases on behalf of the City of Nelsonville, such services being provided under separate contract by K. Robert Toy, Esq., Attorney, Athens, Ohio. The responsibility for prosecution of City criminal misdemeanor cases by Mr. Toy is autonomous in nature, and not within the purview of this Contract.
4. An Itemization of all professional time incurred and costs expended shall be provided by said Attorney. The hourly rate for such legal services shall be \$85.00 per hour. When hours incurred exceed 5.8 hours per month, remuneration shall be made by the CITY on a contract basis, with no employer costs, PERS participation or payroll deduction, to Lavelle Law Offices, L.P.A., Eight North Court Street, 2nd Floor, Post Office Box 661, Athens, Ohio 45701-0661, EIN# 31-1018896.
5. The term of this Contract shall be for a period of two (2) years, effective February 17, 1995 through February 17, 1997.
