RESOLUTION 2117

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENT OF THE CITY COUNCIL TO DESIGNATE THE PUBLIC DEPOSITORIES FOR THE ACTIVE FUNDS OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE; THE TERM FOR RECEIVING APPLICATIONS; AND THE TIME FOR DESIGNATION AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

- 1. That the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, hereby declares its intent to designate the public depositories for the active funds of the City of Nelsonville for a five year period from March 7, 2011 to March 7, 2016.
2. That application from any eligible banks, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Chapter 135 for quintuple designation as active depository, shall be received by the City Council from the 7th day of February until the 14th day of February, 2011, with adequate notice of this Resolution being given, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 135.10.
3. That the designation of depository or depositories shall be made for a period of five years commencing on the 7th day of March 2011.
4. That the Council of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, shall meet in regular session on Monday, February 28, 2011, and designate a depository or depositories.
5. This Resolution is being passed as an emergency measure on first reading pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30 because the designation deadline for the five year designation is March 2011.

RESOLUTION 2118

A RESOLUTION ESTIMATING THE AMOUNT OF INTERIM MONIES FOR DEPOSIT IN PUBLIC DEPOSITORIES; DIRECTING THE TREASURER TO TAKE PERIODIC APPLICATION AND TO AWARD INTERIM DEPOSITS AS MONIES BECOME AVAILABLE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

1. That the City of Nelsonville, Ohio, hereby declares that it will have during the five year period from March 7, 2011 to March 7, 2016 a maximum amount of City monies available to be awarded as interim deposits of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000.00).
2. That the Treasurer of the City of Nelsonville shall accept periodic applications from eligible banks and savings and loan associations, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Chapter 135, as interim monies become available.
3. That the Treasurer of the City of Nelsonville shall award interim deposits to the eligible institution or institutions which offer to pay the highest permissible rate of interest.
4. That the Treasurer of the City of Nelsonville shall notify the Nelsonville Council Finance Committee by letter on or before February 16, 2011 of the maximum amount of interim monies the City of Nelsonville will have before the next quintuple period.
5. This Resolution is being passed as an emergency measure on first reading pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30 because the designation deadline for the five year designation is March 2011.

RESOLUTION 2119

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE OHIO GENERAL ASSEMBLY RENEW THE OHIO HISTORIC PRESERVATION TAX CREDIT.

WHEREAS, 111 applications for the Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credit have generated a projected \$1.2 billion in private investment; and

WHEREAS, historic rehabilitation projects are more labor intensive than new construction projects, and incentives for rehabilitation projects should be promoted to create more jobs; and

WHEREAS, Ohio has a significant untapped resource of 3,700 National Register-listed properties, 3rd most nationally; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credit stimulates the opportunity to take advantage of more federal tax incentives; and

WHEREAS, the greenest building is the one that has already been built; and

WHEREAS, there are 31 states that have programs offering historic tax credits; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credit has had a positive impact in large and small communities throughout ever region of the State, with projects having been approved in 27 large and small communities in 26 counties; and


WHEREAS, the reuse of historic buildings makes Ohio competitive in the global market as we create vibrant, hip communities that will attract and retain our youth and bright, creative entrepreneurs of all ages.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO:

1. That the City of Nelsonville supports the renewal of the twenty-five percent (25%) Ohio Historic Preservation Tax Credit.

RESOLUTION 2120

A RESOLUTION DECLARING FEBRUARY, 2011, TEEN DATING VIOLENCE AWARENESS AND PREVENTION MONTH.

WHEREAS, one in three adolescent girls in the United States is a victim of physical, emotional, or verbal abuse from a dating partner, a figure that far exceeds victimization rates for other types of violence affecting youth; and

WHEREAS, youth who experience physical violence in a dating relationship are more likely to use drugs and alcohol, attempt suicide, and carry patterns of abuse into future relationships; and

WHEREAS, Eighty-one percent (81%) of parents either believe teen dating violence is not an issue or admit they do not know if it is; and

WHEREAS, by providing young people with education about healthy relationships and changing their attitudes away from supporting violence to embracing mutual respect, we recognize that dating violence can be prevented; and


WHEREAS, Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month provides an excellent opportunity for citizens to learn about preventing teen dating violence and to show support for organizations and individuals who provide services and assistance to victims.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO:

1. That the City of Nelsonville declares February 2011 as Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month in Nelsonville, Ohio, and recognizes those organizations that provide critical advocacy, services, and assistance.
2. This Resolution shall be effective at the earliest date provided by law.



RESOLUTION 2123

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE OFFICIAL INTENT AND REASONABLE EXPECTATION OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE ON BEHALF OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE BORROWER) TO REIMBURSE ITS WATER FUND FOR THE EMERGENCY BOOSTER STATION REPLACEMENT PROJECT NUMBER CU10N/CU11N WITH THE PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT DEBT OF THE STATE OF OHIO.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, OHIO:

1. That the City of Nelsonville reasonably expects to receive a reimbursement for certain costs associated with the Water Fund Emergency Booster Station Replacement as set forth in Appendix A of the Project Agreement with the proceeds of bonds to be issued by the State of Ohio.
2. That the maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds, other than costs of issuance, expected to be issued by the State of Ohio for reimbursement to the local subdivision is \$20,000.00.
3. That the Clerk of the City of Nelsonville is hereby directed to file a copy of this Resolution with this City of Nelsonville for the inspection and examination of all persons interested therein and to deliver a copy of this Resolution to the Ohio Public Works Commission.
4. That the City of Nelsonville finds and determines that all formal actions of this City concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of the City of Nelsonville and that all deliberations of this City and any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.

CHILD OF APPALACHIA award in 2005; and


WHEREAS, Mike Brooks was honored as Man of the Year by the

RESOLUTION 2125

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANGER OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE TO APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND ENTER INTO A WATER SUPPLY REVOLVING LOAN ACCOUNT AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF DRINKING WATER FACILITIES; AND DESIGNATING A DEDICATED REPAYMENT SOURCE FOR THE LOAN.

WHEREAS, the City of Nelsonville seeks to construct a Water Treatment Plant; and

WHEREAS, the City of Nelsonville intends to apply to the Water Supply Revolving Loan Account Fund (WSRLA) in order to finance the cost of the design of the drinking water facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Water Supply Revolving Loan Account requires the government authority to pass legislation for application of a loan and the execution of an agreement as well as designating a dedicated repayment source;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NELSONVILLE, ATHENS COUNTY, OHIO:

1. That the City Manager of the City of Nelsonville is hereby authorized to apply for a Water Supply Revolving Loan Account Fund (WSRLA) loan, sign all documents for, and enter into a Water Supply Revolving Loan Account Agreement with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the Ohio Water Development Authority for the construction of drinking water facilities on behalf of the City of Nelsonville, Ohio.
2. That the dedicated source of repayment will be water funds.
3. That this Resolution shall be effective at the earliest moment permitted by law.


